An individual who completes a program at an institution of higher education accredited by NCATE for the type certification sought may be eligible for a professional educator certificate. 2. The program completed shall have been listed in the published annual guide to NCATE accredited institutions as an approved program offered at the degree level for which the institution was accredited by NCATE at the time the program was completed.

Accreditation and acceptance of teacher education programs for specific certification purposes. Teacher education programs at institutions accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. A teacher education program at the bachelor's degree level at an institution of higher learning which was accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education shall fulfill the general and professional preparation requirements and the specialization requirements in the major subject of the approved program indicated on the college transcript. The institution shall have been accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education at the time the degree was awarded. A degree granted within the four-year period immediately preceding the date of initial accreditation of the institution shall be considered as having been granted by an institution, which is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.

The license will be granted upon completion of the "NCATE Recommendation Form" by an authorized licensing official of the degree granting institution.

Iowa

IA --14.31 NCATE accredited programs.

The requirements of the professional education core of subrule 14.19 (3), notwithstanding, an applicant from an out-of-state institution who has completed a program accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education on or after October 1, 1988, shall be recognized as having completed the professional education core set out in 14.19 (3), with the exception of special education.

Rhode Island	RI --Graduates of colleges and universities, which, at the time of the applicant's graduation are fully accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), are eligible for provisional certification in Rhode Island for the area of level of teaching in which the applicant is recommended by his preparing institution. This policy applies only to the applicants who have graduated from the regularly approved education program, specifically approved by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. Furthermore, the policy applies only to the certification of teachers, not to school service personnel, such as principals, supervisors, superintendents and others.

South Carolina Regulation 43-51 A person must earn a bachelor's or master's degree either from an institution that has a state-approved teacher education program and is accredited for general collegiate purposes by a regional accreditation association, or from a South Carolina institution that has programs approved for teacher education by the State Board of Education, or from an institution that has programs approved for teacher education by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE).
